My Declaration of Facts
Item 6. of Trial by Declaration Form TR-205

Attached are 4 exhibits, A through D. Each exhibit is one letter size page.

Exhibit A shows a total of 4 photographs of my vehicle based upon the red light camera documentation sent to me by the Redflex Corporation. Please note that 3 of the photos are very clear. The one photo that is very poor is the most important one and purports to show an image of the driver of the vehicle. (My photocopy machine did cause this image to be worse than the original sent to me by Redflex, but the driver, in my opinion, is unidentifiable even in the Redflex original document.)

Exhibit B is a photocopy of my driver license photograph. I don't understand how any reasonable person could state with any conviction that the Redflex image could be used to identify anyone, especially myself.

Exhibit C is a computer printout of a portion of a webpage from the website shown at the top of the exhibit. The host of the website shows a partial copy of the City of Corona Police Department webpage prior to October 23, 2012. I have indicated with 3 arrows the location of a sentence that had negatively influenced my defense in this case. The sentence reads as follows:

"If you are the registered owner and you were not driving the vehicle at the time of the violation, you must provide the name and address of the person driving."

Exhibit D is a current printout of the same paragraph directly from the City of Corona Police Department webpage and it is clear that this sentence shown above in Exhibit C is no longer there.

It was my original intention to settle this matter with a judge or police official without incurring the necessity for a trial. As alluded to above, I was going to use the poor quality of the Redflex photo to prove that the City of Corona has no viable proof that I was the driver. When the Redflex photo of Exhibit A is compared to the photo on my driver license, it can easily be seen that the Redflex photo allows for the possibility of a much younger person driving my vehicle. The Reflex photo also does not make it clear that the top of my head is virtually bald. These two attributes alone would allow for a large number of males in a police lineup that look nothing at all like myself.

When I investigated the police procedures on their website (www.discovercorona.com) shortly after I received the papers from Redflex and the City of Corona, I noticed the Exhibit C sentence. Even though this sentence appears to be a blatant violation of the
